

XII. 1808. WALTER WYVILL, of Calvert county, in Maryland aforesaid, br. and h. male, being 3d s. (1st s. by 2d wife) of the 8th (*de jure*) Bart., *b.* 4 Feb. 1780; became, in 1808, *entitled to the Baronetcy* [1611]. He *m.*, 3 June 1811, at St. James' aforesaid, Anne WOOD.

XIII. 1840? EDWARD HALE WYVILL, of Calvert county aforesaid, only s. and h., *b.* 14 Sep. 1812; became, on his father's death, *entitled to the Baronetcy* [1611]. He *m.*, 29 Nov. 1832, Mary DAVIS. He was living 1890, his heir ap. being his 1st son, WALTER DAVIS WYVILL, *b.* 8 May 1834, then a merchant at Washington, in the United States of America.

- I. 1611. "THOMAS HOLT, of Aston, *juxta* Birmingham, co. Warwick, Knt.," s. and h. of Edmund HOLTE, of Aston aforesaid (who *d.* Jan. 1592/3), by Dorothy, da. of John FERRERS, of Tamworth Castle, was *b.* about 1571; matric. at Oxford (Mag. Coll.), 9 Feb. 1587/8, aged 17; admitted to the Inner Temple, 1590; Sheriff of Warwickshire, 1599—1600; *Knighthood* at Grimston, 18 April 1603, and was *cr. a Bart.*, as above, 25 Nov. 1611.^(a) Being a person of great learning and influence, he was named by Charles I as Ambassador to Spain, but was excused owing to his great age. In the Civil War he assisted the King by raising supplies, entertained him at Aston for two nights before the battle of Edgehill (23 Oct. 1642), and sent his son to fight in his cause. He was imprisoned, his house plundered, and his estates mulcted, the loss sustained being computed at £20,000. He *m.* firstly, Grace, da. of William BRADBOURNE, of Hough, co. Derby, by (presumably) Frances, da. of John PREIST. He *m.* secondly, Ann, sister of Sir Edward LITTLETON, 1st Bart. [1627], da. of Sir Edward LITTLETON, of Pillaton, co. Stafford, by Mary, da. of Sir Clement FISHER. By her he had no issue. He *d.* 14 Dec. 1654, aged 83, and was *bur.* at Aston. M.I.
- II. 1654. SIR ROBERT HOLTE, Bart. [1611], of Aston aforesaid, grandson and h., being s. and h. of Edward HOLTE, Groom of the Bedchamber to Charles I, by Elizabeth, da. of John KING, BISHOP OF LONDON, which Edward, who was s. and h. ap. of the 1st Bart., by his 1st wife, *d.* during the siege of Oxford, and was *bur.* 30 Aug. 1643, at Christchurch, there. He *suc. to the Baronetcy*, 14 Dec. 1654; was active in promoting the Restoration; was Sheriff of Warwickshire, 1658 to 1660, and M.P. for that county in 1661-79. He *m.* firstly, 23 May 1648, at St. Barth. the Less, London, Jane, sister (whose issue, became in 1722, coheir), of William, 2d BARON BRERETON OF LEIGHLIN [I.], da. of the Hon. Sir John BRERETON (who *d.* v.p., 1629), by Ann, da. of Sir Edward FITTON, Bart. [1617]. She *d.* in childbed, about 1649, and was *bur.* at St. Clement Danes, Midx. He *m.* secondly, Mary, da. of Sir Thomas SMITH, of Hough, Cheshire. She was *bur.* at St. Clement Danes aforesaid, 18 June 1679. Her admon. 1 Aug. 1691. He *d.* 3 Oct. 1679, and was *bur.* at St. Clement's aforesaid. Admon. 12 April 1695.
- III. 1679. SIR CHARLES HOLTE, Bart. [1611], of Aston aforesaid, s. and h., being the only child by first marriage; *b.* about 1649; matric. at Oxford (Mag. Coll.), 29 Oct. 1666, aged 17; B.A., 11 Feb. 1668/9; M.A., 1 July 1671; *cr.* Doctor of Med. 9 Nov. 1695; *suc. to the Baronetcy*, 3 Oct. 1679; M.P. for Warwickshire, 1685-87; a man of great learning and consideration. He *m.* (Lic. Vic. Gen., 3 Aug. 1680, he aged 30, and she 18), Anne, da. and coheir of Sir John CLOBERY, of Winchester, and of Bradstone, co. Devon, by Anne, da. of William CRANMER, of London. He *d.* 20 June 1722, and was *bur.* at Aston. Will pr. 1723. His widow *d.* March 1737/9, at Aston Hall, aged nearly 90. Will pr. March 1738.

IV. 1722. SIR CLOBERY HOLTE, Bart. [1611], of Aston aforesaid, s. and h., *b.* about 1682; matric. at Oxford (Mag. Coll.), 6 June 1694, aged 12; B.A., 3 March 1696/7; M.A., 16 June 1699; Proctor, 1716; *cr.* D.C.L., 18 June 1721; *suc. to the Baronetcy*, 20 June 1722. He *m.* Barbara, da. and h. of Thomas LISTER, of Whitfield, co. Northampton. He *d.* at Aston Hall, 25 July 1729, and was *bur.* at Aston. Will pr. 1729.

V. 1729. SIR LISTER HOLTE, Bart. [1611], of Aston Hall, s. and h., *b.* about 1721; *suc. to the Baronetcy*, 25 July 1729; matric. at Oxford (Mag. Coll.), 4 Feb. 1736/7, aged 15; *cr.* D.C.L., 13 April 1749; M.P. for Lichfield, 1741-47. He *m.* firstly, Oct. 1739, Anne, yst. da. of William (LEGOE), 1st EARL OF DARTMOUTH, by Anne, da. of Heneage (FINCH), EARL OF AYLESFORD. She *d. s.p.*, July 1740, and was *bur.* at Aston. He *m.* secondly, 18 July 1742, Mary, yst. da. of Sir John HARPUR, 4th Bart. [1626], of Calke, co. Derby, by Catharine, da. and coheir of Thomas (CREW), 2d BARON CREW OF STENE. She *d.* 1752, and was *bur.* at Aston. He *m.* thirdly, 1754, Sarah, da. of Samuel NEWTON, of Kings Bromley, co. Stafford. He *d. s.p.*, at Aston Hall, 21 April 1770. Will pr. May 1770. That of his widow, pr. April 1794.

VI. 1770, SIR CHARLES HOLTE, Bart. [1611], of Aston Hall^(a)
to aforesaid, br. and h., *b.* about 1722; matric. at Oxford (Mag. Coll.),
1782. 13 Feb. 1738/9, aged 17; *suc. to the Baronetcy*, 21 April 1770; M.P.
for Warwickshire, 1774-80. He *m.*, in 1754, Anne, da. of Pudsey
JESSON, of Langley, co. Warwick. He *d. s.p.m.*,^(b) 13 March 1782, when the
Baronetcy became *extinct*. Will pr. March 1782. That of his widow pr. July 1799.

GRIMSTON :

I. 1611. HARBOTTLE GRIMSTON, of Bradfield, co. Essex, Knt." s. and h. of Edward GRIMSTON, of the same, by Joan, da. and coheir of Thomas RISBY, of Lavenham, Suffolk (which Edward was s. and h. of Sir Edward GRIMSTON, Comptroller of Calais), was *Knighted* at the Tower, 14 March 1603/4; *suc.* his father, 15 Aug. 1610, and was *cr. a Bart.*, as above, 25 Nov. 1611.^(c) He was Sheriff of Essex, 1614-15; M.P. for Harwich, 1614; for Essex, 1626 and 1628-29; for Harwich (again), April to May, 1640, and Nov. 1640 till his death. He was of Puritanical sentiments, and was imprisoned, 1627, for refusing to contribute to the (forced) loan of that year. He *m.* Elizabeth, da. of Ralph COPPINGER, of Stoke, co. Kent. He *d.* 19 Feb. 1647/8, aged 78. Will pr. 1648.

II. 1648. SIR HARBOTTLE GRIMSTON, Bart. [1611], of Bradfield aforesaid, and, afterwards, of Gorhambury, Herts, s. and h., *b.* 27 Jan. 1602/3, at Bradfield Hall; was a "Pensioner" at Emman. Coll., Cambridge, in 1619, and subsequently a Barrister of Lincoln's Inn; M.P. for Harwich, 1628; for Colchester, April to May, 1640, and 1640 till secluded in 1648; for Essex, 1656-58, and for Colchester (again) in five Parls., 1660-81. Recorder of Harwich, 1634; of Colchester, 1638-53, and of Harwich (again), 1660. He, at first, took part against the King, but, afterwards, espoused his side. He *suc. to the Baronetcy*, 19 Feb. 1647/8, and retired to the continent, 1653-56. At the Restoration he was made Speaker of the House of Commons (25 April 1660) in the Convention Parl.; P.C. Master of

(a) Aston Hall was built by the 1st Bart., being commenced about 1618. According to Dugdale (*Warwickshire*), it "much exceeds for beauty and state any in those parts." By Act of Parl., 1817, it was sold to satisfy the claims of the reversioners under the will of the 5th Bart.

(b) He left an only da. and h., Mary, who *m.*, in 1775, Abraham BRACEBRIDGE, of Atherstone Hall, co. Warwick, but her issue became extinct with her grandson.
